RACY AND RADIANT



Preempted briefly by a State Championship series, the Womens Motocross Nationals is back. And it's back stronger than ever! Racy ladies have gathered from over 20 states across the nation, as well as from England and Canada. Though they represent a variety of backgrounds -- both regionally and of riding ability -- all are united by a common bond: they're serious racers. Gender aside, these ladies are to be commended for their riding expertise and fierce competitive spirit, as will be evidenced here today.

This unique breed dates back some 30-plus years to the 1940's, when daring women raced Velocettes, B.S.A.'s and Matchless 500's across

the then-vast wildernesses.

Women have come a long way since the days of powder puff classes and pink number plates. In the late 60's, increased interest in motorcycling led to more and more organized events...and it was





only natural for ladies to follow suit. Turn-outs were still small, but the level of competition gradually increased. TT Scrambles and desert events were the order of the day. Then, with the introduction of motocross in the 70's, female pit tootsies were quick to demand bikes of their own (much to the dismay of their husbands and boyfriends who were often the object of defeat).

Also in the early 70's, Kerry Kleid became the first woman to earn an AMA professional license. To date, only a handful of women racers have made it to the pro ranks. Among those priviledged (and bold) few are Sue Fish, and most re-

cently, Dorene Payne.

In September of 1972, a group of Southern California racers--female, that is--were invited to Canada as part of the CanAm series. Unofficially, this was the introduction of womens racing to Canada.



About the same time, Lynn Wilson and Mary McGee formed the first female team to ride and finish the grueling Baja 500 desert race in Baja California. McGee later paired up with Cherry Stocton to become the first woman team to finish the Mint 400 in Las Vegas.



Teresa Martin and Debbie Reon were among the first women to venture into speedway racing. Stuntwoman Marcia Holley, a familiar face at local races for many years, set a land speed record for a single engine streamliner motorcycle class. Piloting Don Vesco's Kawasaki Kzl000 "Lightning Bolt," Marcia dialed in two runs at 228.397 and 230.326mph, for a 229.61 average. In doing so, she became the first lady to break into Bonneville's elite 200 mph Club.




Ladies have even ventured to dazzle crowds with spectacular ramp jumps over cars and through hoops of fire. Such daredevils include Debby Lawler (the Flying Angel) and second-Womens National Champion, Teri Kezar. Three MX gals also teamed up to star in Evil Knievel's Australian show, back in 1979. They were none other than Sue Fish, Madylin Almeida and Dawn Grant.

Sue Fish, two-time Womens
National Champion, was scheduled to
do an "incredible" stunt for THAT'S
INCREDIBLE prior to colliding headon with a 4-wheeler at one of the
local tracks. The stunt entailed
jumping a helicopter...while it
was running!

Ladies scored yet another first when expert trialist, Debbie Evans qualified to represent the United States in the Scottish

6-Days Event.

One of the first ladies to race in Europe was none other than first "Powder Puff" Grand National Champion, Nancy Payne. That was back in '74. And even though almost a decade has passed, only a select few women have raced in Europe. Just recently returned from a month of touring and racing, is expertcontender, Mercedes Gonzales.







Diane Cox became one of the first ladies to hold an expert card in flat track, while Carter Alsop earned the same ranking in roadracing. Currently, Tammy Kirk is throwing promoters a curve-her winning style is necesitating the hiring of a trophy guy at flattrack events!

The European motocross circuit is almost exclusively male contested, with a few rare exceptions. One of those is Suzuki-sponsored Vicki Jackson from the United Kingdom, who with the help of two of the Nationals' sponsors--Ultimate Products and Arai Helmets--will be competing today in hopes of attaining her foremost ambition, to be the best lady motocrosser in the world!

Of course, a lot of ladies are hoping to take home the title of Grand National Champion. While others will be content to reign in the 125 or 250 Pro Classes. And not to be overlooked, are the prospective experts of next year competing just as fiercely in the Novice and Amateur classes. 1983 is also the first year we offically have a Veterans class for those 30 years and older. The Vet line-up includes many of the top riders from previous years as well as current hot-shoes!

Second Grand National Champ, Arizonian Teri Kezar, gave So Cal gals quite a surprise back at the '75 Nationals. At the '76 and '77 Nationals, Flyin' Sue Fish reigned, edging out her best friend, Johanna Stenersen.

In May of '77, Butch Lee held the First Womens Invitational at Cycleland in San Antonio, Texas. Sue Fish took home the overall, although she encountered stiff competition from Rhe Helms, who took first overall in the 125 GP.

At the '78 Nationals, the Fish looked like she was going to take the title a third time, dominating the 125 and 250 Grand Prixs on Saturday. In the second day of racing, Sue had a tremendous lead when disaster struck. Her suspension gave way as she came off the big Carlsbad downhill jump. Both rider and bike cartwheeled down

the hill. Surprisingly, Sue escaped with only badly pulled ligaments in her shoulder and ankle, as well as a whiplash.

With Sue out of the running, the attention now focused on a four way battle for the title. It was down to the last moto as Carey Steiner edged out Dede Cates, Rhe Helms and Roxie Klatt for the overall title.

Dede Cates came back in 1979 to win the title. Another strong contender that year was Barbara Spielman from Chicago, Illinois. Barbara fell in one of the motos, working her way from the absolute last to second overall, to finish runner up to the title.

That same year, Kathy Holman of Texas, won the Womens Invitational class at the Astrodome for the second time.

1980 saw two champions: Dede Cates reigning in the 125 Pro class and Barbara Spielman in the 250. While in 1981, only the 125 Pro class was run...with Texan, Kathy Holman taking home the honors.

Earlier this year, at the AMA Amateur National Championships in Tennessee, Lisa Akins of Michigan beat out Kim Douglass of California, for the win. The absence of the Nationals in 1982 was somewhat compensated by the debut of womens racing at Japan's "Superbowl of Motocross." In a half-time exhibition race, Americans Gale "MX Mom" Webb, Karen Leitinger, Kim Douglass, Dede Cates and Charlene Ho, dazzled a sold-out crowd with their ability...and beauty!


